Candles have been ordered, and once they have arrived we can start to use them for Saturday Exposition and also for other services which I have in mind - notably Vespers (Evening Prayer) and Benediction on a Sunday evening.

Do please pray for Tom and Greta, and also for their daughter Angie, to whom must go special thanks for dealing with the ordering and cost of the candelabra. Although she lives in the south, I do hope she will be able to come up to Easingwold soon to see these splendid, beautiful memorials of her parents.
