## Coronavirus

I am aware of considerable anxiety in certain parts of the parish regarding the heavily-reported spread of the Coronavirus. In order to lessen people's distress and possibly to reduce the risk of transmission I have decided the following:

- 1) From now on the chalice will not be available at Mass; Holy Communion will be under one kind only.
- 2) The Offertory Procession will not take place.
- 3) The sign of peace is henceforth to be omitted.
- 4) Holy water will no longer be available at the Church entrance.
- 5) The use of hand-gel from the dispenser at the back of Church is strongly recommended.

These measures are to take immediate effect and will last until the risk of infection is no longer present.
