NHS Track and Trace App

To comply with Government regulations there are posters with the Church location at the back of church. There are also posters with the Hall location in the Hall. If you have the app, do please "check in" to the church one. Unless you are using the Hall as a Slimmer (the only Hall activity at the moment), please don't scan the poster in the Hall.

No booking for Weekday Mass - Please continue to book in for Sunday Mass.

As we have settled into a routine, it has become apparent that we have capacity at a weekday Mass for all those who regularly come. We will keep to a seating plan, but Kathryn has set it up so that every regular parishioner is on it. For track and trace purposes, we will go by those that the Steward checked off as they arrived. There will still be one or two spare places. Unfortunately, there are too many variations for us to follow this method for Sunday, but it seems to be working for Wednesday and Friday.

- Cleaning after Mass on a Wednesday: We have a kind volunteer who wipes the benches down after Wednesday Mass. It would be gratefully appreciated if someone else could volunteer to do this, so that the duty would only be on alternating weeks. Please see Kathryn if you would be able to help in this way.
- Holy Communion: Remember, please do not queue down the aisle as in pre-COVID times, but move to the altar step. Once you have taken communion you may return to your seat, as long as no-one else is still moving into place. If they are, please stand still by the altar until your passage is clear. The back rows around the Stewards' table do not need to come forward. Fr James will come to the back to give communion not only to those with mobility issues, but also anyone in the Lady Chapel and the Stewards themselves.

Opening of the Church for Mass: Reminders re the Guidelines we are following

Thank you to all those who are helping in whatever way to allow us to do this.

1. IF YOU SHOW ANY SYMPTOMS OF THE VIRUS, PLEASE CONTINUE TO SELF-ISOLATE AND DO NOT COME INTO CHURCH.
2. **Under normal circumstances, the church will be open for 9:30am Mass on Wednesdays and Fridays and for Mass at 10am on Sundays.** The church is closed during the remaining time for thorough cleaning.
3. Please wear a face-covering and sanitise your hands on entering and on leaving the premises.
4. Stewards will be present to guide you through the process, and ensure government guidelines are maintained.
5. Please use the one-way system: enter through the main church door and exit via the sacristy and hall. **[Note that Wednesday is now an exception to this rule as the Hall is occupied.]**
6. Please take a bulletin away with you, but, once you have touched one, do not return it to pile.
7. There is an assigned seating plan based on the bookings received prior to Mass
8. We are told that the lighting of candles presents a fire risk due to the inflammable nature of hand-gel; if you do wish to light candles, please take the greatest care. There is a fire extinguisher in the porch.
9. The Lady chapel may be used, but only one person (or one household) at a time.
10. The balcony remains closed; the staircase is too narrow to make social distancing possible.
11. We minimise risk by minimising surfaces to be touched. Please avoid touching the statues and Wren furniture as we do not wish to damage them by the enhanced cleaning necessary.
12. Please avoid using the loos if at all possible; if you do use them, please advise a steward or Kathryn/Fr James so they can be wiped down afterwards.
13. We cannot use holy water and during mass there will be no intercessions or sign of peace.
14. At Holy Communion you will be guided as to when to leave your seat. The whole of your row will go at once, and no other row will go until you have returned to your seats.
15. Fr James cannot greet people at the end of mass - the rules state that people should leave promptly.
