**IF YOU SHOW ANY SYMPTOMS OF THE VIRUS,  
PLEASE SELF-ISOLATE AND DO NOT COME INTO CHURCH.**

<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li><b>Under normal circumstances, the church is open for 9:30am Mass on Wednesdays and Fridays and for Mass at 10am on Sundays.</b> The church is closed during the remaining time for thorough cleaning.</li><li>Please wear a face-covering and sanitise your hands on entering and leaving Church.</li><li>Stewards will guide you to assigned seats, &amp; help you follow government guidelines.</li><li>Please use the one-way system: enter through the main church door and exit via the sacristy and hall. <b>[NB: Wednesday is an exception as the Hall is occupied.]</b></li><li>Please take great care lighting candles because of the inflammable nature of hand-gel. (Fire extinguisher in the porch).</li><li>One person (or one household) only in the Lady chapel at a time. The balcony remains closed under current conditions.</li></ol>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>At Holy Communion follow the Steward's guidance. Please do not queue down the aisle, but fan out along the altar step. Please hold your hands out at arms' length.</li><li>Fr James cannot greet people at the end of mass - the rules state that people should leave promptly.</li><li>Minimise risk by minimising touch:<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Please avoid touching the statues and Wren furniture; we do not wish to damage them by the enhanced cleaning necessary.</li><li>Please avoid using the loos if at all possible; if you do use them, please advise us so they can be wiped down afterwards.</li><li>Please take a bulletin away with you.</li><li>There will be no holy water in the stoup</li><li>There is no sign of peace during Mass.</li></ul></li></ol>
