Abbot Robert's Blessing

This Monday (the 22nd), Abbot Robert will have his Abbatial Blessing in the Abbey Church. The Bishop will perform the blessing, and the Abbot President and Mgr Hogan will be present, along with the monastic Community. Because of COVID restrictions there will sadly be no other guests, but I am sure you will want to pray for the new Abbot on this very important day for him and for us all; he is facing many challenges of course, but with God's great help he will be able to rise to them all, being deeply aware of how entirely the future belongs to God. May he be richly blessed in his Abbacy! Fr James.

Holy Week Services

This is just an initial note to you all to let you know that all the services will be taking place this year, as indeed they did last year, but this time of course there can be a congregation! We are still restricted as to the number of people who can attend, so it will be important to book a place as usual – we really must not go over the permitted number!

The times of the services should be the same as two years ago (see below), but there will of necessity be some changes which the bishops have decreed; for example, on Palm Sunday the service cannot begin outside but must all take place in the church (I know, I know!!), and the congregation is asked to take their palms as they *leave* Mass; on Maundy Thursday there is to be no washing of the feet, nor can we have an altar of repose: instead, the Blessed Sacrament will be on the altar for some time after Mass.

On Good Friday the Veneration of the Cross will have to be different this year, as will the Easter Vigil on Saturday evening, in that there can be no blessing of the New Fire; there will be fewer readings than usual and there is to be no sprinkling of the people with Holy Water.

These changes – these diminutions – are of course a response to the pandemic; we must all look forward to resuming the services once again in all their power in the future. Nonetheless, the essentials are all there and we can be certain that God will bless us fully if we celebrate the liturgies devoutly and with faith; far from losing out, we may find ourselves even more richly blessed because of our response in love to the demands the virus has placed upon us.

The times of services will be as follows:

Palm Sunday (28 March): As normal

Maundy Thursday (1 April): 7pm Good Friday (2 April): 3pm Easter Vigil (3 April): 8.30pm Easter Sunday (4 April): 10am
