#### **COME BACK TO CONFESSION!**

Since public confession became possible again, use of this vital source of healing and grace has been tragically low across the country – and also in our own parish. This is a great source of worry to me, and I am constantly reminded of the warning to priests/prophets in Ezekiel 3:18 or 33:8 (although even in writing this I wonder how many will bother to look it up...).

My dear friends, we all know we sin, but a lot of the time we live and think as though we don't, and we must face this! God has given us a pattern for living (of thinking, speaking and acting) but because we are human we often fall short of His plan. We are in fact called to be *fully human* and need to turn to our Father as often as we can and beg Him for the help we so badly need; coming to Him to confess our sins is His will for us; it is not up to human logic or self-comforting rationalisation to go against that and we try to do so at our great peril.

In the Catholic Church confession has been on the wane for many years – not due to covid but to an alarming secularisation of thought, a loss of the sense of the Sacred and, to put it bluntly, of wilful pride. Far too many priests and bishops have not attempted to confront this grave threat over the years and the people have suffered as a result: my friends, I wish to have no part in this!

Of course it is not always easy to come to confession: admitting what we have done comes easily to very few, but what a source of comfort and true healing it is. When we receive this Sacrament of Reconciliation we not only have our sins forgiven but also receive a huge influx of grace – that is to say, of the overwhelming love of God – and of strength. I need this sacrament and I can be equally sure that you do too, so please come: at the moment I hear confessions in the Lady Chapel on **Saturdays** between 10:45am and 11:30am. Please come! Make it necessary for me to provide *more* times for this great healing sacrament – believe me, I shall be overjoyed to do so!

May I repeat: I am bound (as every priest is) by the seal of the confessional. I can, and will, never reveal what people tell me. No priest carries around in his head what he has been told: we are well-trained in this! The priest is simply Christ's instrument; it is He who is speaking when the beautiful words of Absolution are spoken – it is, after all, He who forgives.

Every penitent in our church has the choice of sitting opposite me to confess or to confess anonymously, kneeling behind a screen. If you are not sure how to make your confession, any priest administering the sacrament will help you along – how could we not, when it is Christ who has longed for you to turn to Him in this way! Some people find they cannot bring themselves to confess to their parish priest – in that case, confess to a priest in another parish! I shan't know unless you tell me, and I will simply be glad you have been if you ever do.

Zechariah chapter 1 verse 3: "The Lord of Hosts says this: Return to me.....and I will return to you!" Take God at His word: the time may be short!

May God bless you all.
