## Reminder of our current practices

We think it far better to play it safe and go cautiously for the next few weeks or so, since cases across the country are still rather high. The following guidelines are based on the instructions issued by the bishops:

- There is no need to book a place at mass, however please bear in mind that this may result in a fuller church, especially at weekends!
- The church will be thoroughly cleaned once a week, but sprays and cloths are available for wiping down door handles and high-touch areas (not the Wren furniture!)
- Please continue to sanitise your hands when entering.
- Wherever possible, please try to find a seat which is not directly behind anyone else.
- Please continue wearing masks/face-coverings unless you are exempt. Masks are designed to protect principally those in our vicinity rather than ourselves and many parishioners will feel far more re-assured if those near them are wearing them.
- The Offertory procession, the Sign of Peace, Communion from the chalice and the use of holy water remain suspended. As far as I know, the Sunday/Holyday obligations remain suspended also.
- Singing will be resumed once local infections have greatly reduced.
- Please go up for communion starting with row A, then B, C etc, leaving as much space as possible as you queue.
- On your way out of church please be very sensitive to the concerns of others and avoid forming a crowd as you approach the doors and porch.
- Please try to remember the letter label of the row you were in, in case someone later proves covid-positive; we could then send an email out with a localised area of risk.
- Sadly, I feel it is wiser to delay the re-introduction of coffee after Sunday Mass!

So for the time being it is, largely "more of the same"; the bishops' emphasis now is to respond to conditions as they are in the locality, so you may be sure that it is my intention to remove ALL restrictions as soon as possible once it is clearly safer to do so in this area. In the meantime we must pray hard for each other and, indeed, for the whole world as this pandemic continues. Fr James.
