There is no age limit: all are welcome to serve, so if you are prepared to continue (or begin for the first time in this parish....) please contact me so we can start as soon as possible. I should be very happy to train up people who have not served here before – *ut in omnibus glorificetur Deus*: so that in all things God may be glorified!
