PRAY FOR UKRAINE

Many of you will have heard Fr Wulstan and Fr Hugh mention Pope Francis' appeal for prayers for the suffering people of Ukraine. The Pope called for a special day of prayer and fasting on Ash Wednesday for the whole nation – President Zelenksiy, the government and all the leaders, political and military, of that country.

From the earliest times of the Church, the saints have spoken of the three "pillars" of our Faith: Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving. Now we are being called to take these as seriously as we can. In his appeal, the Holy Father wrote: "I encourage believers in a special way to dedicate themselves intensely to prayer and fasting on (Ash Wednesday). May the Queen of Peace preserve the world from the madness of war." Let us make this Lent a time of prayer and fasting, with perhaps more seriousness than in any other previous year, and let us also remember the third "pillar" – almsgiving:
