Parish Update

The Parish Finance Committee met for the first time since COVID, and many things were discussed. For instance there are outstanding works to be done to all of the premises, which were flagged at the recent Quinquennial Survey. It has hard to find additional funds to set some of these projects going, particularly because the Parish is still paying off the loan we took out from the Abbey for the Church refurbishment. This still stands at just over £40,000. Whilst the interest rate is low, we have already paid out £10,000 interest since 2016 and it would evidently make sense to get the capital paid off as quickly as we can.

We are all suffering under the increased cost of living, but if you are able to increase your offerings in any way, or make a one-off donation, it would all be of great assistance.

The biggest help to our finances would be if we could let out the Priory, and this is being investigated. Works would be needed to separate off the house from the Church, and there is obviously a lot of administration in arranging such a letting. We are taking advice from the Abbey Trust and their Estate Agent.

We will have a Parish Forum to present the idea to you Your opinions are valuable, and if we were to go ahead we would obviously need the backing and assistance of the Parish to do so. The Forum will be after the 7:00pm Mass for the Ascension on Thursday 18 May.
