Upcoming visit to Stanbrook Abbey

The Benedictine Sisters of Stanbrook Abbey in Wass are celebrating the 400th anniversary of their foundation this year. On 31 December 1623, nine young Englishwomen received the Benedictine habit in the newly founded monastery of Our Lady of Consolation in Cambrai, then in the Spanish Netherlands, now in the north of France. A year and a day later, on 1 January 1625, the sisters made their solemn vows and the community was officially born, staying in France until the French Revolution. In 1795, the nuns who survived the Revolution returned to England and eventually settled at Stanbrook in Callow End, Worcester in 1838, where they stayed until they moved to Wass in 2009. So, 2024 is a special year of celebration for the Stanbrook community.

National Novena to St Joseph – 10-18 March

Each year St Joseph's Missionary Society (the Mill Hill Missionaries) prepares for the feast day of St Joseph – their patron – with a special Novena of Masses and prayers.

Prayer is the foundation of all mission work, both in this country and abroad. The Novena is a wonderful way for the faithful to pray for each other, and build links of prayer across the world for missionaries and the people they serve.
